Dear Village of Ilion Resident,

Beginning in April, the village enters into a new waste and recyclables collection contract. The new contract will be with our current contractor Spohn's Disposal. I am very pleased to announce that as part of the new contract all properties will receive a recycling cart regardless of whether they utilize Village bags or rent garbage carts. The goal of the new program is to increase recycling and make collection more efficient in the Village of Ilion. Through recycling, we are able to conserve landfill space, raw materials and energy. Through the use of the new recycling carts, we can reduce litter and help beautify the Village.

Starting in April 2018, all households in the village will receive a cart for *recyclables*. Distribution of the new carts will take place at the end of March. The carts are property of Spohn Disposal and are not to be transferred to another location. All recyclable items must be placed loosely, with no plastic bags, string or twine, inside the new recycling cart with lid closed to be eligible for weekly pick-up. Recyclables placed outside of the recycling cart will not be picked up. **Do not place garbage/trash in the recycling carts.**

Remember to mix all recyclables (paper, plastic, metal and glass) in your new cart labeled "RECYCLING". Each recycling cart is clearly labeled depicting acceptable recyclable items. Recyclable items must be placed in your recycling cart loosely, **with no plastic bags, string or twine.** Cardboard boxes must be cut into smaller pieces so that they fit loosely inside the cart.

On the reverse side of this letter is information that will guide you and your family through the new recycling and trash collection process. Also included are the updated Village of Ilion Solid Waste and Recycling Guidelines. Please keep the information handy as it contains answers to frequently asked questions, telephone numbers and website information.

Additionally, as part of our new collection contract, multi-unit properties (two family or greater) will be allowed to set out an additional bulk item per week.

Thank you in advance for your assistance with this new recycling initiative.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON YOUR NEW RECYCLING CART

All households in the Village will receive one cart for recyclables (at no additional charge).

LOADING YOUR CART

Each cart has easy to follow instructions on what items are accepted for recycling. All recyclable items must be placed inside the cart loosely, with no plastic bags, string or twine.

Please note: Cardboard boxes must be cut into smaller pieces so that they fit loosely inside the cart. Recyclables will not be accepted if they are placed outside of the recycling cart.

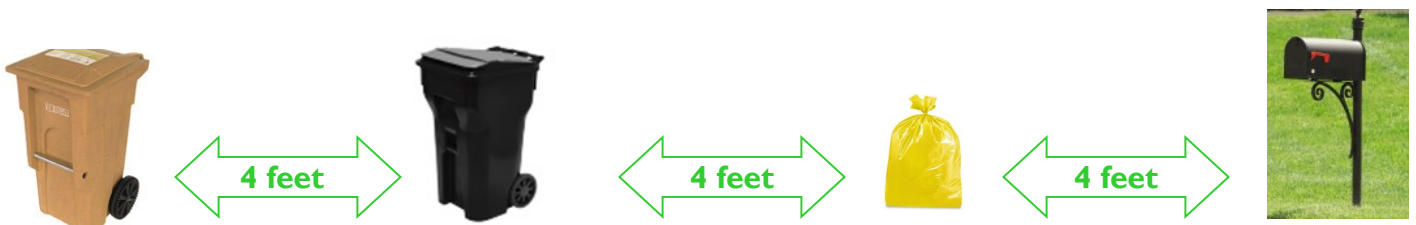
DO NOT PLACE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR RECYCLING CART:

- GARBAGE
- ELECTRONICS
- BATTERIES
- CERAMICS
- PLASTIC BAGS
- PAINT CANS
- LIGHT BULBS
- WINDOW GLASS
- STYROFOAM
- HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE
- YARD WASTE
- SHARPS (NEEDLES/SYRINGES)

PLACING CART FOR COLLECTION

- Make sure the lid is closed.
- Lid opening must face the street.
- Place cart no less than two (2) feet from the curb.
- Carts should be placed at least four (4) feet from obstructions such as garbage bags, garbage carts, mailboxes, parked cars, fire hydrants or utility poles.

Please note: The best placement for recyclables and garbage is on opposite sides of the driveway.

SOLID WASTE/TRASH/RECYCLING/GREEN WASTE GUIDELINES - EFFECTIVE 04/01/2018

Residents have the option to use either Village of Ilion garbage bags or carts. The bag and cart system applies to all Village residents and businesses that do not have private dumpster service or a private collection dumpster contract. **Please note: Residents who do not participate in the public solid waste collection system will not receive service for recycling, bulk items, electronic waste, steel/metal items, major appliances/white goods, and/or green waste collection.**

Households that utilize Village garbage bags or the cart system for garbage/trash will also receive a cart for recyclables. All recyclables must be placed inside the cart loosely, with no plastic bags, string or twine. Recyclables placed outside of the cart will not be picked up. Cardboard boxes must be cut into smaller pieces so that they fit loosely inside the cart. See reverse side for recycling guidelines.

VILLAGE GARBAGE BAGS

If you choose to use Village of Ilion garbage bags, they are available at:

CART SYSTEM

If you choose to participate in the cart system, please contact the Oneida-Herkimer Solid Waste Authority Office via email at rachels@ohswa.org or by phone at (315) 733-1224 ext. 2000 to arrange for cart service.

Cost for Carts [Payments to be made quarterly, in advance.]

32-gallon = \$66.00 per quarter 64-gallon = \$82.00 per quarter 95-gallon = \$101.50 per quarter

LARGE QUANTITIES OF TRASH [This includes all construction and demolition material]

- Call a private hauler to rent a dumpster.
- Small pieces of wood, lumber, or construction debris can be placed in Cart or in Village trash bags (**DO NOT** mix with yard waste).
- Construction & demolition debris must be removed by the resident or by arrangement with a private hauler.

SCHEDULE/RULES FOR SETTING OUT GARBAGE AND RECYCLABLES

- Garbage, Trash and Recyclables Collection: **Wednesday, Thursday & Friday Routes**
- Garbage should **NOT** be out before 3:00 PM the day before collection but **SHOULD** be out before 12:00 Midnight.
- Garbage Bags **SHOULD NOT EXCEED 50 pounds.**
- Empty carts or cans must be removed from the curbside by 8:00 PM on collection day.
- If your garbage or recyclables are not collected, contact Spohn's Disposal Service at (315) 866-8820.

BULK ITEMS COLLECTED WEEKLY [NOT BULK ITEMS: Wood, Lumber, Construction Debris, Plaster, Wall Board & Plywood]

- Bulk items are defined as large household items (i.e., couch, chair, mattress, table, rug (rolled & tied), lamp, cabinet, dresser, etc.).
- **ONE** bulk item **per each single-family property** may be put out on the same day as your garbage pick-up (i.e. dining table set of one table and four chairs equal five items, which will take five weeks to dispose). **Multi-units** (two family or greater) are allowed **TWO** bulk items per week.
- Items must not be too large or heavy for two men to lift.

ELECTRONIC WASTE, STEEL, METAL ITEMS, MAJOR APPLIANCES & WHITE GOODS COLLECTED TWICE A MONTH FOR PROPER RECYCLING

- **These items will be collected on the first and third Friday of each month.**
- These items need to be called in to Spohn's Disposal Service at (315) 866-8820 in order to be put on a pick-up list. Please call before the collection day and state what needs to be picked up (i.e., computer, TV, washer, dryer, refrigerator, water heater, etc.) so that special collection arrangements can be made.

GREEN/YARD WASTE COLLECTION [GREEN/YARD WASTE MUST BE CONTAINERIZED OR TIED/BUNDLED]

- **Set out Sunday night for Monday pick-up starting in April and continuing through the second week of November.** No container should exceed 50 pounds.
- **Green waste (grass clippings, leaves, garden waste and shrub clippings) must be placed in a reusable container only.**
- **DO NOT place green waste in Plastic Bags.**
- Green waste should be free of stones, wood, paper, plastic pots/trays and animal waste.
- Lumber and other construction debris **IS NOT** considered brush or yard waste.
- Brush and shrubs cannot exceed four feet (4') and must be placed in a reusable container or tied and bundled.
- **Christmas trees will be collected at the end of December and during the month of January.**

FALL LEAF COLLECTION: The Village of Ilion DPW will pick up leaves in the Fall. Leaves must be placed loose at the curb for collection. Scheduling and preparation for this service will be announced by the Village DPW. (**1st Monday in November - As long as weather permits.**)

SPECIAL ITEMS

Tires: Residents can deliver tires to the Authority's EcoDrop Utica (80 Leland Ave Ext.) or contact a private hauler to have them removed.

Used Motor Oil: Take to a service station/oil redemption center or to the Authority's EcoDrop Utica (80 Leland Ave Ext.).

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS

★ All Recyclable Items Mix Together In One Bin For Collection ★

1. All recyclable items—paper, plastic, metal, and glass—need to be mixed together loosely in one container.
2. Recyclables must be placed in the Village recycling cart.
3. Lids and labels should be left on recyclable containers. Containers should be empty and rinsed before recycling.
4. Do not place recyclables in plastic bags for collection. No string, no trash or green waste allowed.

DO NOT INCLUDE:
Plastic Bags, Styrofoam Containers, Toys, Motor Oil Bottles, Prescription Bottles or Clothes Hangers



METAL

Food & Beverage Cans
Deposit Cans
Aluminum Foil
Aluminum Plates & Trays
Aerosol Cans
Metal Lids

DO NOT INCLUDE:
Propane Tanks, Metal-Cardboard Containers (Cocoa & Motor Oil), Clothes Hangers, Silverware or Small Appliances



GLASS

Green, Amber & Clear Containers
Canning Jars
Deposit Bottles
Liquor & Wine Bottles
Food & Beverage Containers

DO NOT INCLUDE:
Broken Glass, Drinking Glasses, Ovenware or Ceramics, Dishes, Mirrors, Window Glass or Light Bulbs

★ ONLY ONE EXCEPTION TO THE RULE: SHREDDED PAPER – Place in a clear plastic bag with your recyclables ★

Items That **SHOULD NOT** Be Placed In Your Recycling Bin

- **Sharps**
Do not set out with your recyclables! Place used needles, syringes and lancets in a puncture-proof plastic container like a laundry detergent bottle with a top. When full, tape lid/top shut, label as "sharps" and place in the garbage.
- **Plastic Bags**

- **Ceramics**
- **Clothes Hangers**
- **Drinking Glasses**
- **Electronics**
