All pickups coincide with your garbage collection.

All garbage, recyclables and large bulky items at roadside by 6:00 AM, but not sooner than the day before.

NOTE: Ashes and sawdust MUST BE PUT IN PLASTIC BAGS. Flying ashes and sawdust can cause blindness! Please do not use bleach on garbage or recyclable bags or cans as it can cause blindness and it ruins clothes.

NOTE: Beginning 1/1/2018 all rubbish containers can be no larger than 45 gallons.

When a Holiday falls on a Monday through Thursday, we will collect your garbage and recyclables on the day after. If the Holiday falls on a Friday, we will do our collection on Thursday.

Please leave garbage and recyclables out the next day too, as sometimes we run out of time.

Holidays observed by the Sanitation Department: New Year's Day, President's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

The garbage and recyclables must be on the side of the driveway opposite from the mailbox. (If mailbox is on the left, then the garbage and recyclables will be on the right side of the driveway.)

All items listed below need to be placed loose, in Yellow Recycle or properly marked container no bigger than 45 gallons. Does not apply to Green Waste.

FOOD & BEVERAGE GLASS METAL & AEROSOL CANS MILK & JUICE CARTONS JUICE BOXES Collected each week	Glass: To be washed, lids removed. (NO window panes, light bulbs, Corning glass or pottery.) Metal Containers: Tin & aluminum cans, washed out, empty aerosol cans. <u>(NO paint, Pesticide or Chemical aerosol cans.)</u> <u>(Empty paint cans: covers off, set along side of garbage.)</u> Milk & Juice Cartons, Juice Boxes: (Washed out)
PLASTICS Plastic Bottles & Containers (With or Without Number Code) Collected each week	Plastics: To be washed out, placed in Yellow Recycle container, or marked can. Soda bottles, milk, water, ketchup, mustard, baked goods containers, drink cups, soup & Detergent bottles. etc.
NEWSPAPERS* CORRUGATED CARDBOARD* MAGAZINES* FLAT CARDBOARD* (Cereal boxes, cake mix boxes, Gift boxes, Laundry detergent boxes, Paper towel cylinders, Pizza boxes, etc.) Collected each week	All Paper & Cardboard Loose: Placed in recycle container. Newspapers & Ads*: Loose in container. Corrugated Cardboard*: Boxes must be broken down (3'x3') not to exceed 40 lbs. (No waxed or plastic coated cardboard). Magazines*, Glossy Catalogs*: Loose Flat Cardboard*: Remove paper, foil or plastic liner, plastic carrying handles. Flatten empty boxes, loose.
JUNK MAIL (Envelopes, Rules paper, Office paper, Colored paper) Collected each week	Junk Mail: Loose Put out with recyclables loose in containers. Shredded Paper - in a clear plastic bag
GREEN WASTE (Lawn clippings, Leaves, Flowers, Shrubs) (Tree trimmings, Root balls, Cut off Trees & Shrubs) Collected each week Collected from April 1st to Dec 1st	Green Waste: To be placed out in clear plastic bags only! Not weighing more than 50 lbs. If garbage is mixed with green waste or green waste is not in clear plastic bags, or clearly marked container it will not be picked up. Tree Trimmings: Cut 8 to 10 foot lengths, no larger than 10" diameter. Limit 1 Pile 4 foot high by 8 foot long, butt or cut end facing the road. Brush and limbs 4 foot and shorter tied in 40 lb. bundles. No brush or trees from land clearing projects will be collected.

No Contractor's Debris

If a contractor cuts it, mows it or rakes it they must remove.

1st FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH (Tires, Batteries, Appliances) (All Light & Heavy Metals) Must be separated from Garbage. Electronics	Batteries: Automotive acid type – NO LIMIT. Tires: Not mounted on rims or wheels – 2 per household ONLY. Appliances: Stoves, refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers. Doors removed from all appliances. (Must be garbage-free and empty). Hot water tanks, pots and pans, metal lawn chairs, metal storm windows, doors. Tables, chairs, and metal cabinets, air conditioners & dehumidifiers. Light Metal: Bicycles, lawn mowers, swing sets and all light metals cut into 6 foot lengths. Heavy Metals: Cast iron, Cast iron tubs, sinks, pumps, engine blocks and all heavy steel. All fuel tanks cut in half. Drum or pails larger than five (5) gallons must be cut in half. TV's, Computers, Microwaves, Fax Machines, GPS, SEE LIST ON LAST PAGE
2nd FULL WEEK OR EACH MONTH (Large Household Furnishings)	Household Furnishings: Stuffed furniture, box springs, mattresses, tables, chairs, vacuum cleaners, rugs (in 4 foot lengths), pads, coffemakers, Artificial xmas trees.
3rd FULL WEEK OF EACH MONTH (Construction & Demolition Debris)	Construction & Demolition Debris: Small projects will be picked up if properly bundled or boxed – 6 foot lengths, limit four (4) boxes or bundles per household, NOT to exceed 40 lbs. each. Also ceramic and fiberglass sinks, toilets and bathtubs. Fiberglass tub enclosures and hot tubs. NO CONTRACTORS DEBRIS: Large projects must hire Dumpster Service. It will not get collected!!

Here's How It Works

NOW ALL RECYCLABLE ITEMS MIX TOGETHER IN ONE BIN FOR COLLECTION.

- All recyclable items—paper, plastic, metal, and glass—need to be mixed together loosely in one container.*
- Recyclables must be placed in your designated recycling bin or a marked durable plastic or metal lidded container of your choice, under 45 gallons and not more than 50 pounds.
- Do not place recyclables in plastic bags for collection. No string, no trash or green waste.

*Lids must be removed from all containers before recycling

Paper

- Newspaper & Inserts
- Junk Mail & Circulars
- Magazines & Catalogs
- Phone & Paperback Books
- Brown Grocery Bags
- Lightweight & Corrugated Cardboard

DO NOT: Hard Cover Books, Napkins, Paper Plates, Tissue Paper, Soda & Beer Cartons, or Construction Paper

Plastic

- With or Without
Number Code

- Beverage Cartons
(Milk, Water, Juice and Juice Boxes)
- Windshield Washer Jugs
- Soap & Detergent Containers

DO NOT: Plastic Bags, Medicine Bottles, Styrofoam, Toys, Motor Oil Bottles, or Clothes Hangers

Metal

- Food & Beverage Cans
- Deposit Cans
- Aluminum Foil
- Aluminum Plates & Trays
- Aerosol Cans
- Metal Lids

DO NOT: Metal-Cardboard Containers (Cocoa & Motor Oil), Silverware or Small Appliances

Glass

- Green, Amber & Clear Containers
- Canning Jars
- Deposit Bottles
- Liquor & Wine Bottles
- Food & Beverage Containers

DO NOT: Broken Glass, Drinking Glasses, Ovenware or Ceramics, Dishes, Mirrors, Window Glass or Light Bulbs
