First Place – Declan, Poland. Declan used cardboard, egg cartons, old roofing materials from his treehouse, hangers, soda and shampoo bottles, and old homework assignments to make a Dragon costume.

Second Place – Chris, Bridgewater. Chris used cardboard, old buttons, aluminum foil, and even got a haircut to complete his Knight costume.

Third Place – Daniel, Waterville. Daniel used outgrown pajamas, cardboard, scrap particle board, plywood and PVC, and an outgrown dog harness to make a Boba Fett costume.

"Each of these costumes are really great examples of what can be done with just a little bit of DIY skills," said Authority Recycling Coordinator Eileen Brinck. "Recycling and upcycling are great ways to avoid generating extra waste during your Halloween celebrations. The Authority is very proud of Declan, Chris, Daniel and all 15 others that shared their Green Halloween Costumes with us this year!"
